Maths	Summer 1	During the first half of this term, the children will be focussing on revision for the SATs test. We will focus on Reasoning and Arithmetic skills so that the children feel confident in these areas. We will be going over topics such as Fractions, Percentages, Ratio, Algebra, Pie charts and Geometry. After SATS, the children will be completing lots of fun Maths challenges to really get them thinking!	Social- the sharing of resources and ideas within the classroom. Using percentages in real life situations. Vocational –aspiring to achieve and do their best for the future.
	Summer 2	The children will continue to improve their Arithmetic and Reasoning skills to prepare for Secondary School and complete lots more Maths challenges. They will also look at the work of different Mathematicians.	Social- solving problems related to the real world. Striving to overcome challenges.
English	Summer 1	During the first half of this term, the children will be focussing on revision for the SATs test. We will revise the different types of text and reading questions and will be covering the grammar topics, which the children are less confident in. We will then start studying a whole class novel 'Carrie's War', which we will use to support us with writing for the KS2 assessments.	Vocational –aspiring to achieve and do their best for the future. Increase writing stamina to prepare for secondary school Moral- explore moral issues through -writing
	Summer 2	We will continue to study 'Carrie's War' and will be building up a portfolio of writing for the KS2 assessments.	Cultural- learning about war leaders from different countries during the war. Moral- Through stories, look at how people have overcome adversity and how they cope in difficult situations. Look at the issue of war (conflicts/ fighting) Vocational –aspiring to achieve and do their best for the future.

RE	Summer 1	The children will compare the 4 different Gospel accounts of the Resurrection appearances, know that like Thomas, we do not always have to see to believe and know that Christ promises Eternal life to those who believe in him. We will look at the story of Pentecost and how the Holy Spirit can help us in our own lives.	Vocational- as a follower of Jesus, we have a commitment to service of God and know whatever they feel called to do in life is a vocation
	Summer 2	The children will Learn about the importance of belonging to our parish and The Church. They will also learn about Mary and the Saints, which includes researching the Saints and using Scripture to create their own version of Heaven.	Spiritual- an opportunity to explore and develop a set of virtues Vocational- We are called to act like the saints.
Science	Summer 1	Through our topic, 'Evolution and Inheritance', we will be looking at how different species change and adapt over time as well as studying some famous evolution scientists, such as Charles Darwin. We will also be looking at which characteristics we have inherited from our parents	Spiritual- a sense of awe, wonder and mystery at God's creation Social- understand change is a part of God's plan and we can change our lives for the better by making the right choices Moral- God has granted us the freedom of choice. Explore human interference with evolution
	Summer 2	Through our topic 'Electricity', we will be revising how to stay safe when using electricity and will be looking at different circuit designs and what happens when we change these. ICT	Summer 1	Children will use computer software to accomplish given goals, including collecting, analysing, evaluating and presenting data and information. The children will be working as a team to design, manage and create a project of their own choosing using technology. History / Geography	Summer 1	The Mayans- the children will explore the ancient civilisation of The Mayans including: how they lived, farmed and worshipped their gods	Social- looking at how the Mayans worked together, supported and provided for one another. Opportunity for collaborative working
	Summer 2	We will be learning about the manmade and natural features of coastal regions and comparing these to those found in cities such as Wolverhampton.
